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Imaginative Artworks in "Survival" Exhibit

Paintings, prints, sculptures and photography express the theme of "Survival" in this year's exhibit of Club artist members' works organized by the Art Committee. The exhibition runs until January 12, 2015. Survival of the environment, survival in nature, and survival in life are

interpreted and imagined in 20 works of art displayed in the Crentz Room.

The white plumes of the Great Egret (cover) were prized for ladies' hats in the late 19th century. The birds were hunted almost to extinction for their feather adornments. Survival of the Great Egret sparked the conservation movement and became a symbol of the National Audubon Society founded to protect birds.

The photographer writes "I wanted to photographically capture the Great Egret and celebrate all who have worked at keeping our natural history alive and well."

The photograph was taken in natural light by **Jackie Bailey Labovitz** ('14) at the J.N. Ding Darling National Wildlife Refuge in Florida.

Barbara Kerne's ('04) "Lovers" (top right), a woodcut with hand coloring, is a personal image of the artist's relationship to nature that is ever-changing. "Landscape, myth and memory are the subjects of my work," she writes.
